


WASHINGTON FAMILY RELIEF FUND (WFRF)

WILDHORSE FOUNDATION AWARDS FUNDING FOR STAR PILOT PROJECT

HOOP (Housing Obstacles Overcome by Participation) is a pilot program which will help 14 people earn a \$700 security deposit voucher following completion of a 6-module Ready-to-Rent class plus 20-hours participation. Vouchers must be redeemed before December 31st. Applications are currently being accepted, with the first group beginning May 16th.

I worked an assortment of seasonal jobs including Yellowstone National Park, Mt. Spokane, sorting seed potatoes, and processing Alaska snow crab. I moved to Walla Walla in 2018 and began working for the Walla Walla Community College in 2020 when I began teaching at the Washington State Penitentiary. I love teaching and quickly discovered that the students in my WSP classes were some of the most gracious and appreciative people that I have ever worked with. As I got to know them for who they are and what they wanted. I became as excited for each of them as we worked together to establish goals and setting the stage for their transition back into the community. My students taught me about the many gaps in community support services that they had to face as they left WSP. This is what led me to STAR and to pursing a master's degree in Sociology.

I started as a STAR volunteer in May 2022, when the organization was struggling with unexpected funding changes and staff turnover. I accepted the role as Executive Director and started working at STAR fulltime in September 2022. I look forward to building a team which focuses on fostering hope and building a supportive community environment for individuals who want to move forward towards improving their lives and the lives of their families.
